DAY 1 BUENOS AIRES

WED, MAR 16

Arrive today in the cosmopolitan city of Buenos Aires, often referred to as the "Paris of South America". Check-in at your luxurious hotel and enjoy free time until you join your group mid-afternoon to experience tango dancing first-hand. Time to brush up your dancing skills with a 1-hour private tango lesson before you proceed to your **Argentine Experience** venue.

Tonight, learn about Argentine culture, taste fantastic local dishes, drink exceptional wine. A gourmet meal with a twist, **The Argentine Experience** serves up the best of Argentine cuisine and culture with a slice of international perspective. DAY 2 BUENOS AIRES

THUR, MAR 17

After a leisurely breakfast, head out for your tour **Fiesta Gaucha at Estancia Santa Susana w/barbecue lunch**.

Estancia Santa Susana has belonged to the Rossiter family since 1860. Its 1200 hectares are devoted mainly to agriculture also to cattle and horse breeding. Enjoy a welcome drink with 'empanadas' (meat pastries) at the 'pulpería' and later taste a typical Argentine barbecue (grilled beef, chicken, pork sausages, salads, dessert and coffee) for lunch.



Lunch will be followed by a folklore show with live music, dancing and a tango demonstration, and it will end with 'cuadreras' and ring races where gauchos show their skills as riders. End your visit with home-made pastries and 'mate' (typical green tea). Return back to your hotel in the late afternoon and enjoy your evening at leisure.

DAY 3 BUENOS AIRES

FRI. MAR 18

After breakfast, continue exploring this marvelous city with a guided tour of **Palermo**, a sprawling neighbourhood of treed boulevards lined with elegant mansions, eclectic restaurants. Visit **Recoleta**, a stylish area known for its Paris-style townhouses, lavish former palaces and posh boutiques and stroll through the famous **Recoleta Cemetery** to witness its valuable works of art and Evita's tomb. End your tour this morning with a walk along the colourful streets of **La Boca** and have lunch at a local restaurant. Return to your hotel for some free time and join the group again for a performance at **Colon Theatre** (subject to programme scheduling).

DAY 4 BUENOS AIRES TO USHUAIA

SAT, MAR 19

After breakfast, this morning you will transfer to the airport for your flight to **Ushuaia**, located on the **Tierra del Fuego** archipelago, the southernmost tip of South America, nicknamed the "**End of the World.**" The windswept town, perched on a steep hill, is surrounded by the **Martial Mountains** and the **Beagle Channel**. It's the gateway to **Antarctica** cruises and tours to nearby **Isla Yécapasela**, known as "**Penguin Island**" for its penguin colonies.

Dinner this evening is at the hotel restaurant.

DAY 5 USHUAIA

SUN, MAR 20

After breakfast, depart from the hotel to the tourist wharf of Ushuaia to board a catamaran and sail the waters of the **Beagle Channel** along the **Bay of Ushuaia**. Enjoy the panoramic view of the city. Traverse the north shore of the channel passing through the **Archipelago Bridges** and **Les Eclaireurs Lighthouse (End of the World),** where you can see colonies of many seabirds that nest on islands and cliffs, colonies of sea lions and various birds of the marine and coastal environment (cormorants, albatrosses, petrels and oystercatchers, among others). After a visit to the Lighthouse, the tour



continues towards the **Estancias Punta Segunda** and **Remolino** and the abandoned ship **"Monte Sarmiento"**, semi-sunken since 1911. The tour runs along the coast of the **Beagle Channel** towards **Isla Grande**, outlined by rolling hills. An approach to **Martillo Island** where a **Magellanic penguins'** colony is found. You will disembark and walk with the penguins.

Return to the estancia and enjoy free time for lunch. In the afternoon, return to your hotel by bus and join the group again in the evening for dinner at the hotel.

DAY 6 USHUAIA TO EL CALAFATE

MON, MAR 21

Your Patagonia travel adventure continues as you transfer to the airport for your flight to **El Calafate** today. One of the most remote towns in Argentina, it is also one of the most visited. Travellers come here to enjoy the vast, untouched landscape mother nature has created. A small, picturesque village on the shores of **Lake Argentino**, **El Calafate** is named for a wild bush with yellow flowers and blue berries that flourishe here; it is also known as the "**Village of the Glaciers**," the gateway to **Glacier National Park**. Check in at your accommodations at **Xelena Hotel & Suites and** join your group after for a visit to a local museum, **the Glaciarium**, dedicated to the science of glaciers and the geological history of the area.

Group dinner this evening at the hotel restaurant.

DAY 7 EL CALAFATE & LAGO ARGENTINO TUE, MAR 22

After breakfast, drive to **Glacier National Park** to witness one of South America's most breathtaking natural wonders, **Perito Moreno Glacier**. Upon leaving the city, along the right side of the road, you will see **Lake Argentino** with **Redonda Bay**, which offers an interesting variety of bird life. At the entrance to the **National Park** there is a drastic change in the vegetation rich in the special types of trees found in the Patagonian Andes: ñires, and cherry trees.

Fronting **Lake Argentino** for three miles, rising 240 feet from the water in dense clusters of jagged white skyscrapers, **Perito Moreno** is one of the few glaciers in the icefield that is advancing, its restless movement unseen but sometimes heard in its eerie groaning, cracking, and rumbling.

During the tour a walk along the paths on the front of the glacier allow a view of this impressive natural marvel from a different perspective. Enjoy a **Nautical Safari El Calafate boat tour** and return to Calafate. Dinner is at the hotel restaurant.

DAY 8 EL CALAFATE TO PUERTO NATALES WED, MAR 23 Journey to Puerto Natales, where, after a late lunch, you will enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure. Opened in 1940 and honored as a National Heritage site, the Singular Patagonia was once a cold-storage plant. Today it features an industrial museum on site and offers a wide range of expeditions and activities, such as horseback riding, trekking and mountain biking. Choose your preferred mode of exploration and

experience this incredible location on your own terms.

THUR, MAR 24

DAY 11 PUERTO NATALES TO SANTIAGO

SAT, MAR 26

After a leisurely breakfast, fly to **Santiago**, capital of Chile, a vibrant city set against the backdrop of the **Andes**. It sits some 2,000 feet above sea level in **Chile's Central Valley** and is surrounded by a ring of spectacular mountain peaks.

Enjoy free afternoon and join the group again for dinner at a local restaurant.

DAY 12 SANTIAGO

SUN, MAR 27

After breakfast, start the day with a tour of **Santiago**, a city of contrasts with remains of Colonial past and ultramodern high-rise buildings of the financial center. Your tour begins by heading south through the downtown area, passing t **Club Hípico**, a beautiful horseracing track in the older residential area of the city. You then proceed alongside the **Parque O'Higgins** and the **Cousiño Palace**, built between 1870 and 1878 for the wealthy **Cousiño** family.

From here you head along the famous **Alameda**, Santiago's colourful main avenue, to the heart of the city, seeing the **Chilean University**, **San Francisco Church** and the **Santa Lucia Hill**, site of Santiago's foundation in 1541. Then you will visit the **Plaza de Armas** and the cathedral.

Continue your tour with a drive to **Santa Rita Winery**. Learn about the property's 120 years old history and its role it's played in the lives of noble families and famous poets. Enjoy wine tasting and lunch at Dona Paula restaurant and after lunch return to your hotel. Enjoy your evening at leisure.
